Planning Director Ashley Fox elaborated that the re-subdivision application was to replace single-family dwellings with townhomes. The Planning Commission held a public hearing on July 20, 2023, and reviewed the preliminary plats for Willow Creek Estates Filing No. 2. After conditions were met, the Planning Commission voted unanimously on July 18, 2024, to recommend the re-subdivision application to the City Council with the following conditions: the developer shall install a water stub-connection, blowoff hydrant, and line valve in the northeast corner of the development, on the west side of Highway 67. The developer shall also provide a permanent 40-foot-wide easement for the water stub connection from developed street, River Rock Blvd, to the edge of the right-of-way for Highway 67.

Motion to approve Ordinance 9 - 2024, an Ordinance approving Willow Creek Estates Filing No. 2, a re-subdivision of lots 1 through 25 and lots 126 through 143, Willow Creek Estates Subdivision Item, based on the requirements delineated in the City of Florence Subdivision Regulations, the City Council finds the Final Subdivision Plats and Address Plat for Willow Creek Estates Filing No. 2, a Re-Subdivision of Lots 1 through 25 and Lots 126 through 143, Willow Creek Estates Subdivision, are hereby approved, and subject to the following conditions based on the recommendation of the City Engineer:

Staff Recommendation:

Approve the Pioneer Park usage for Bugling Elk Vineyards & Winery and Millenium Grown LLC.

Background/Description of Item:

Millenium Grown LLC. is an event planning organization that intends to host and produce the Southern Colorado BBQ Challenge at Pioneer Park. The registered agent on file for Millenium Grown LLC. is Amy Dawn Bourlon-Hilterbran. The festival is anticipated to take place on the following dates /times:

- Friday, September 27, 2024, from 4 PM 10 PM
- Saturday, September 28, 2024, from 12 PM 10 PM
- Sunday, September 29, 2024, from 12 PM 6 PM

The park has been appropriately reserved with City Hall Staff, and Millenium Grown LLC. plans to have licensed local vendors provide liquor for on-premise consumption.

Due to the location and nature of the festival, Special Event Insurance will be required as a provision of use. It should be noted that Special Event coverage is typically granted to an applicant by their insurer approximately thirty to forty-five (30-45) days prior to the event. As such, Staff suggests making approval contingent upon receipt of proof of Special Event coverage.

The City of Florence does not approve festival permits at the Local Licensing Authority level. Therefore, once the applicant has paid the appropriate fees and all supporting documentation has been submitted this item will be sent to the Colorado Department of Revenue Liquor Enforcement Division for State approval.

Under Colorado Liquor Rules 1 CCR 203-2 Regulation 47-405(A)(1), only certain license types are eligible to file a Festival Permit Application with the Colorado Department of Revenue and obtain a festival permit. As a non liquor-licensed entity, Millenium Grown LLC. does not meet these eligibility requirements. However, Bugling Elk Vineyards & Winery, located at 1215 Apple Lane in Penrose, meets the eligibility requirements and has applied to be the legal licensee for the Festival Permit Application.

Financial Impact:

The City fee for Pioneer Park usage with alcohol is \$125.

Department: Planning

Background / Description of Item:

• J + M Investments, owner of Willow Creek Estates Subdivision, submitted a re-subdivision application for lots 1 through 25 and lots 126 through 143. The lots will be re-subdivided to accommodate townhomes rather than single-family dwelling units.

Staff Comments:

- A variance request pertaining to the townhome structure setbacks, lot width and minimum lot size was approved by the City Council on May 15th, 2023.
- 3 Rocks Engineering conducted a drainage analysis dated May 5, 2023, for the proposed Willow Creek Estates Filing No. 2 and found the original detention design will accommodate the proposed additional development.
- A rezone request for Willow Creek Estates Subdivision, lots 1 through 25 and lots 126 through 143 from MH Manufactured Home Zone District to R-2 Low Medium Denstiy Residential (One to Four Units) Zone District was approved by City Council on July 17, 2023.
- Fremont Sanitation District provided a will-serve letter for the development stating they had an adequate wastewater collection facility in the vicinity, as well as the treatment plant capacity to serve the additional density proposed by the potential re-subdivision.
- ❖ The Planning Commission convened on July 20, 2023, for a Public Hearing and review of the Preliminary Plats for Willow Creek Estates Filing No. 2 and approved the Plats subject to the following conditions:
 - Valid CDOT Access Permit that acknowledges the potential additional lots.
 - CDOT Access Permits for the Willow Creek Estates Subdivision, acknowledging the additional lots associated with the potential Willow Creek Estates Filing No. 2, was received on June 20, 2024.
 - o A system wide water analysis to verify the adequacy of a single tap point from Arrowhead Drive, with approval by Jacobs Engineering.
 - Isocobs Engineering has provided a statement outlining the final report from 3 Rocks Engineering, who conducted the system wide water analysis, that a single connection to the City's existing distribution system on Arrowhead Drive is suitable for Willow Creek Estates Subdivision and the potential additional lots associated with Willow Creek Estates Filing No. 2. Jacobs Engineering does recommend, however, that the developer construct a water stub-connection, blowoff hydrant and line valve in the northeast portion of the development. This connection will provide long-term distribution benefits for the development and the City of Florence.
 - o Final engineering on water tap size for each four-plex, with approval by Jacobs Engineering.
 - Jacobs Engineering has provided a statement stating that the final report from Professional Engineering Consultants does demonstrate there will be sufficient water pressure for a 1" water tap size for each four-plex.

- o An address plat/sheet for Willow Creek Estates Filing No. 2
 - Address plat has been received.
- O Plat Note stating that the Developer will provide seven Union Ditch water shares or an acceptable alternative prior to the official recording of the Final Plat.
 - Note has been added to the potential final plat map.
- o Plat Note adding the terminology from the 'Assignment and Acceptance' letter, which assigns the interests and obligations of the original Subdivision Improvement Agreement, dated 10/04/2007, related to infrastructure improvements to J+M Investments, LLC to the 'Acknowledgement and Acceptance of Plat' Statement.
 - Note has been added to the potential final plat map.
- The Planning Commission convened on July 18, 2024, to examine details pertaining to the Willow Creek Estates Filing No. 2 Final Plats and conditions associated with them. Upon review of all information, the Planning Commission voted unanimously to approve the Final Plats for Willow Creek Estates Filing No. 2 and recommended the plats to City Council for a final decision along with the following conditions based on the recommendations of the City Engineer:
 - ❖ a) The developer shall install a water stub-connection, blowoff hydrant and line valve in the northeast corner of the development, on the west side of Highway 67.
 - ♦ b) The developer shall provide a permanent 40-foot-wide easement for the water stub connection from developed street, River Rock Blvd, to the edge of the right-of-way for Highway 67.

Ordinance No. 9 - 2024 was approved unanimously at the August 5, 2024, City Council meeting. Ordinance No. 9 - 2024 was published in full in *The Daily Record* on August 8, 2024.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Florence, Colorado, pursuant to Colorado statute and the Florence Municipal Code, is vested with the authority of administering the affairs of the City of Florence, Colorado; and

WHEREAS, the City Council for the City of Florence has authority to adopt and enforce ordinance governing land use, zoning and the development of lands pursuant to, among other authority, C.R.S. §31-23-101 and C.R.S. §29-20-101; and

WHEREAS, the owner submitted the proper application and paid the appropriate fee for a Re-Subdivision of Lots 1 through 25 and Lots 126 through 143, Willow Creek Estates Subdivision, known as Willow Creek Estates Filing No. 2; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held, after proper notice was published, posted and mailed, before the Florence Planning Commission pursuant to Florence Municipal Code Section 16.01 on Thursday, July 20, 2023, regarding the application and preliminary plats, at which time, by unanimous vote, the Florence Planning Commission recommended approval of the preliminary plats subject to recommendations. The Florence Planning Commission convened on July 18, 2024, regarding the final plats and recommendations, at which time, by unanimous vote, the Florence Planning Commission recommended approval of the final plats for Willow Creek Estates Filing No. 2, a Re-Subdivision of Lots 1 through 25 and Lots 126 through 143, Willow Creek Estates Subdivision, subject to the following conditions based on the recommendation of the City Engineer:

- a) The developer shall install a water stub-connection, blowoff hydrant and line valve in the northeast corner of the development, on the west side of Highway 67.
- b) The developer shall provide a permanent 40-foot-wide easement for the water stub connection from developed street, River Rock Blvd, to the edge of the right-of-way for Highway 67.

WHEREAS, on August 5, 2024, the City Council reviewed the final plats for Willow Creek Estates Filing No. 2; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to approve the final plats for Willow Creek Estates Filing No. 2, Re-Subdivision of Lots 1 through 25 and Lots 126 through 143, Willow Creek Estates Subdivision.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE FLORENCE CITY COUNCIL AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The City Council incorporates the foregoing recitals as findings by the City Council.
- 2. That certain Willow Creek Estates Filing No. 2, a Re-Subdivision of Lots 1 through 25 and Lots 126 through 143, Willow Creek Estates Subdivision is hereby approved subject to the following conditions based on the recommendations from the City Engineer:
 - a) The developer shall install a water stub-connection, blowoff hydrant and line valve in the northeast corner of the development, on the west side of Highway 67.
 - b) The developer shall provide a permanent 40-foot-wide easement for the water stub connection from developed street, River Rock Blvd, to the edge of the right-of-way for Highway 67.
- 3. The Mayor is hereby authorized to indicate the City Council's approval of the Willow Creek Estates Filing No. 2, by signing the plat, a copy of which is attached here to and incorporated here in as Exhibit A. A true and correct copy of all plats for the property shall be deposited with the City Clerk and a copy of this Ordinance, and the Willow Creek Estates Filing No. 2, a Re-Subdivision of Lots 1 through 25 and Lots 126 through 143, Willow Creek Estates Subdivision, Plats shall be filed with the Clerk and Recorder of Fremont County.
- 4. City Staff is hereby authorized to take any and all necessary steps to complete this subdivision of Willow Creek Estates Filing No. 2, a Re-Subdivision of Lots 1 through 25 and Lots 126 through 143, Willow Creek Estates Subdivision.
- 5. Severability. If any article, section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is held to be unconstitutional or invalid for any reason such decision shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and each part or parts thereof irrespective of the fact that any one part or parts be declared unconstitutional or invalid.
- 6. Repeal. Existing ordinances or parts of ordinances covering the same matters embraced in this ordinance are hereby repealed and all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed except that this repeal shall not affect or prevent the

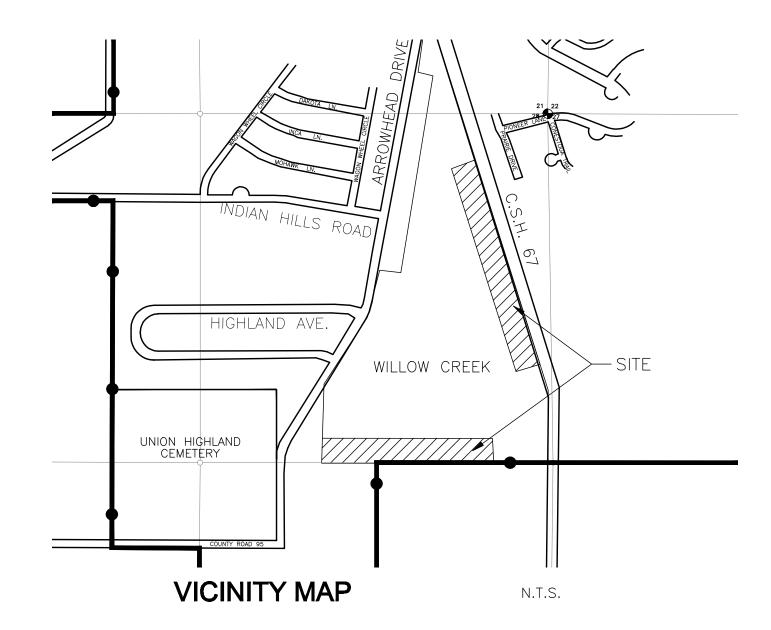

Department: Planning

Background / Description of Item:

• PikeView Development Corporation, owner and developer of the remaining vacant lots of Pike View Estates Filing 1 have requested a change to the construction phasing and the restriction of issuance of building permits outlined in the current subdivision improvement agreement.

Staff Comments:

- Changes to the construction phasing for the development will allow the developer to add five additional lots to Phase 1, making it more financially feasible for the construction of Wagon Wheel Circle.
- Section VII: Restriction on Issuance of the amended agreement changes all instance of "Building Permits" to "Certificate of Occupancy" or "Temporary Certificate of Occupancy".

This change was made due to the nature of the structures that are part of this new development. The homes arrive prefabricated or manufactured, meaning there is nothing to build in the traditional sense, except the foundation, as there would be with a stick-built home. The developer has run into issues with ordering lead times and cannot control when a manufactured unit will arrive. For manufactured homes, the building permit simply allows the home to be set on a foundation and put together. Without a building permit, the developer/contractors are unable to set the home on a foundation and join the sections of the home together, which may lead to deterioration of the home's separate units.

This change to the improvement agreement will better protect the City from potential financial exposure, as a manufactured home is of more value and less of a potential nuisance to the City if placed on a foundation and put together properly.

SUBDIVISION IMPROVEMENT AGREEMENT RELATING TO INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS OF PIKE VIEW ESTATES SUBDIVISION FILING 1

	THIS AMENDED SUBDIVISION IMPROVEMENT AGREEMENT, dated this _	day
of	, 2024, is between the City of Florence, a municipal corp	poration
of the	State of Colorado (the "City"), and PikeView Development Corporation (the "Deve	loper").

WHEREAS, Developer is the owner of certain real property located in the City of Florence, Colorado, legally described as follows:

Lots 14 through 16 inclusive and lots 18 through 21 inclusive, but NOT lots 13 and 17, Block 1, and Lots 2 through 22 inclusive, Block 6, and all of Blocks 2, 3, 4, and 5, Pike View Estates, according to the plat recorded February 22, 1980, under Reception No. 465685, Fremont County, Colorado (the "property"); and

WHEREAS, on June 22, 1995, the Florence City Council passed Ordinance No. 9-95, adopting new Subdivision Regulations for the City of Florence; and

WHEREAS, on July 3, 1995, the Florence City Council adopted Resolution 21-95, adopting Public Improvement Design and Construction Standards for subdivisions in the City of Florence; and

WHEREAS, Article I, Section 9 of said Subdivision Regulations defines a "Subdivider" as "Any person, firm, partnership, joint venture, association, or corporation who shall participate as owner, promoter, developer, or sales agent in the planning, platting development, promotion sale or lease of a subdivision"; and

WHEREAS, Article I, Section 9 of said Subdivision Regulations defines a "Subdivision Improvement Agreement" as "The contract or instrument used to specify the public improvements required in the subdivision and containing one or more security arrangements which may be accepted by the City of Florence to secure the construction of such public improvements"; and

WHEREAS, Part I, Section 1 of said Public Improvement Design and Construction Standards states "The subdivider or developer is responsible for the design and construction of all public improvements associated with the subdivision or property being developed. This responsibility includes both on-site and off-site improvements necessitated by the subdivision or development. Unless otherwise specified in this Resolution, the subdivider or developer is responsible for 100% of cost of the improvements"; and

WHEREAS, Article I, Section 5.3 of said Subdivision Regulations states "All officials and employees of the City of Florence who are vested with the authority to issue permits by the City Council or by state statute, shall not issue permits, record documents, conduct inspections or

otherwise perform any duties or administrative actions that are not in conformance with the provisions of this Ordinance", and

WHEREAS, the City is willing to issue building permits for construction on the property upon the acceptance of the Developer of the terms and conditions of this Agreement; and subject to all the requirements, terms and conditions of the City Subdivision Regulations, the City Public Improvement Design and Construction Standards and all other applicable laws, ordinances, rules and regulations; and

WHEREAS, the City and Developer mutually acknowledge that the matters set forth in this Agreement are reasonable conditions and requirements to be imposed by the City in connection with its issuance of building permits on the property, and that such conditions and requirements are necessary to protect, promote and enhance the public welfare; and

WHEREAS, it is further mutually acknowledged that the City is entitled to other assurances that the matters agreed to by the Developer will be performed as agreed by the Developer, and that the laws of the State of Colorado pertaining to city planning provide that the collateral used as security for the construction of the agreed upon public improvements may include a restriction on the issuance of building permits or a restriction on conveyance of any lots, or both; and

WHEREAS, the Developer has elected to use the restriction on building permits as the form of collateral to secure the construction of the public improvements specified in this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the parties acknowledge previous subdivision agreements relating to the construction of subdivision improvements in Pike View Estates subdivision, which agreements were recorded in the public records of Fremont County, Colorado, on October 7, 1996, in Book 1262, page 406, Reception Number 653907, and on November 19, 1996, in Book 1266, page 599, Reception Number 655854, and February 8, 2001, Reception Number 726352, the terms and conditions of which the parties wish to amend to allow the development of the subdivision, and the construction of subdivision improvements, in five (5) phases, and to allow the posting of a specific security for costs to complete phased infrastructure improvements.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises, it is agreed as follows:

I. IMPROVMENTS TO BE COMPLETED

The Developer shall be responsible for all streets, curbs, gutters, sidewalks, pans, drainage, water and sewer improvements within the property and all off-site improvements that serve the property, as specified in this Agreement. All improvements shall be constructed to the satisfaction of, and shall be inspected and approved by, the City and other agencies having jurisdiction, pursuant to all applicable laws, ordinances, rules and regulations. The Developer shall not proceed with subsequent improvements until all previous improvements have been inspected and approved or with written approval of the Public Works Department and the City Manager. The Developer shall be responsible for notifying the applicable agencies in a timely manner to obtain all required

inspections and approvals at each stage of construction and shall also be responsible for maintaining and presenting said improvements in a manner that allows for proper inspection, The Developer shall be solely responsible for any costs necessary to maintain, and present said improvements for inspection.

II. WATER AND SEWER EXTENDSION AND INSTALLATION

- 1. The Developer will extend water service to the property in accordance with the ordinances and regulations in effect at the time of the specific water request. The first-come, first-served policy will govern availability of water service to the property. Water service to the property may be limited or curtailed in the same manner and to the same extent that such service is limited or curtailed for other city residents.
- 2. Upon completion and approval, all water mainline extensions required by the City and by the Developer shall be dedicated to the City of Florence, free of any and all liens and encumbrances whatsoever.
- 3. The Developer agrees to install, at the Developers sole expense, all required water distribution and sewer collection lines within the property. All such water distribution and sewer collection lines, and associated facilities, shall be installed in accordance with the standards and specifications of the City of Florence and the Fremont Sanitation District. Upon completion and approval of the water distribution and sewer collection lines, the Developer agrees to dedicate to the City and Sanitation District unobstructed rights-of-way necessary for all for water and sewer lines to serve the property, or for transmission through the property, which dedication shall be free of all liens and encumbrances whatsoever. In addition, the Developer shall grant temporary construction easements for installation of water distribution and sewer collection lines, and associated facilities, whenever required by the City and the Fremont Sanitation District.
- 4. The Developer will cooperate with the City in dedicating, designing, and planning for all water and sewer utility easements that may be required by the City. The Developer acknowledges and agrees that the City has the right to change unilaterally its water development charge, water distribution facilities development charge, connection charge, tap fee, oversize line recovery amounts, and such other fees, charges or allocations of costs as have been adopted or may be adopted in its rules and regulations at any time in the future, so long as such changes are of general application, The Developer will pay all such fees and charges when due. All such charges shall be a lien on the property from the date due until paid. Upon the failure of the Developer to pay the fees and charges in full and in a timely manner, the City may, upon the giving of ten (10) days written notice to the Developer, proceed to foreclose its lien on the property in the same manner provided for the foreclosure of mechanic's liens, subject to all rights of redemption granted by Article 39 of Title 38, C.R.S as amended.
- 5. The Developer will comply with all rules, regulations, and requirements of the Fremont Sanitation District in installation and maintenance of sewer lines and facilities.

III. STREETS, CURBS, GUTTERS AND SIDEWALKS

- 1. The Developer shall design, install, and fully improve, to the City's standards, all public streets, curbs, gutters and sidewalks which lie fully within the property; and all the streets lying on or abutting the exterior boundaries of the property, all at the sole expense of the Developer and without cost to the City. Such obligation on Developer includes those public streets, curbs, gutters, and sidewalks, or portions thereof, required to maintain continuity and affecting lots 1, 13, 17, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, and 27, Block 1, and lot 1, Block 6, Pike View Estates Filing 1, according to the plat recorded February 22, 1980, under Reception No. 465685, Fremont County, Colorado even though Developer does not own those lots and they are not part of the "property" as defined in this Agreement.
- 2. The Developer shall, at the Developer's sole cost, design and construct any bridges or culverts required by virtue of this proposed development, in accordance with the applicable laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations of any governmental body or entity having jurisdiction of such matters, whether federal, state, county, or municipal.
- 3. The Developer shall pay for installation of all required traffic and street signs, traffic control devices, permanent barriers, and streetlights, including all associated conduit for all streets within or contiguous to the property. The City Manager shall be solely responsible for determining the requirements for such improvements to the property, consistent with all state and federal laws, rules and regulations. Streetlights will be required on collector and larger streets or at intersections for public safety as deemed necessary by the City Manager. Upon acceptance of the streets, the City will maintain any traffic and street signs and traffic control devices, provided that they meet City and State standards. Streetlights will be maintained pursuant to the City's franchise agreement with the electrical provider.

IV. FIRE PROTECTION

The Developer shall design, install, and fully improve, to the standards of the City and the Florence Fire Protection District, all necessary facilities for fire protection to serve the property.

V. UNDERGROUND UTILITIES

All new utilities installed within the property shall be installed underground unless another form of installation is specifically approved by the Florence City Council, in advance.

VI. PERMANENT EASEMENT

The Developer hereby agrees to dedicate to the City, free from all liens and encumbrances, all permanent easements for all utilities, storm drainage, water and sewer extensions, and streets upon the property.

VII. DEVELOPMENT BY PHASE

The Developer may develop the property in not more than five (5) phases, as described in the attached Exhibit "A" to this Agreement. Before the Developer commences construction of infrastructure improvements associated with any phase of the development, the Developer shall notify the City, in writing, of the date upon which construction will commence. Nothing contained in this agreement shall prevent the Developer from commencing construction of the infrastructure improvements for more than one phase at the same time, or from commencing construction of the infrastructure improvements for subsequent phases prior to the completion of such construction in prior phases. The Developer shall have a period of eighteen months from the date of giving notice of commencement to the City within which to complete the infrastructure improvements required by this agreement for the phase relative to which notice has been given. The phases described in the attached exhibit may not be altered or amended without the express approval of the City Council.

VIII. RESTRICTION ON ISSUANCE OF CERTIFICATES OF OCCUPANCY

Except as otherwise permitted by this Agreement, in order to secure the performance of the obligations imposed on the Developer in this agreement, so long as any infrastructure improvements required within a phase under development by the Developer, or any part thereof, remain unfinished and unapproved by the City of Florence and other applicable agencies, the Developer shall not apply for any certificate of occupancy or temporary certificate of occupancy for any lots within that phase and the City Building Inspector shall not issue any certificate of occupancy or temporary certificate of occupancy for said lots. However, this restriction does not affect the Developer's ability to apply for and obtain building permits for any lots within the phase under development, provided all other conditions and requirements for the issuance of such permits are met. As for lots in phases not under development, the Developer shall not apply for any certificate of occupancy or temporary certificate of occupancy until notice of commencement of construction has been given to the City and all infrastructure improvements required for such phase have been completed, inspected and approved by the City and all other applicable agencies.

IX. RELEASE OF RESTRICTION ON CERTIFICATES OF OCCUPANCY

Upon recommendation of the City Manager, the City Council may release the restriction on certificate of occupancy or temporary certificate of occupancy on all or a part of the lots contained in a phase of the development prior to completion of the public improvements specified in this agreement and which are required for that phase, upon provision to the City of acceptable collateral to secure the completion of the required construction, as provided in the Subdivision Regulations of the City. The collateral may be in the form of an escrow deposit, performance bond, irrevocable letter of credit, or any other form acceptable to the City Council. The amount of collateral shall not be less than 125% of the estimated cost of the construction of the public improvements, as estimated by the City Manager.

X. RELEASE OF COLLATERAL

Upon completion of all public improvements required in a phase under development and acceptance of those improvements by the City and all agencies having jurisdiction, the Developer may apply to the City Council for release of all or part of any collateral previously provided to cover the cost of those public improvements. Upon certification by the City Manager that the public improvements appurtenant to a phase under development have been completed and are in conformance with all applicable standards, the Council shall authorize the release of the collateral, except that the Council may withhold ten (10) percent of the collateral for a period not to exceed eighteen (18) months from the date upon which the Developer gave the City notice of commencement of construction of the phase, in order to insure that the improvements have been properly constructed. If such improvements have not been properly constructed within such time, the City Council may initiate proceedings for plat vacation, as set forth in Section XI, or may take such other action, without limitation, and including the use of the remaining collateral to complete construction or the filing of an action for specific performance, as may be deemed necessary to insure completion of the public improvements.

XI. TIME OF COMPLETION

The Developer agrees to make every reasonable effort to complete all public improvements within each phase within eighteen (18) months from the date of giving notice of commencement of construction within that phase to the City. If the improvements in a phase under development have not been completed or an extension of the time period has not been granted by the City Council, the City Council may initiate proceedings to vacate the plat, or those portions of the plat where improvements have not been completed, or may take such further action, without limitation, including the filing of an action for specific performance, as may be deemed necessary to insure completion of the public improvements, or including drawing upon any letter(s) of credit, security, or other surety provided.

XII. ORDINANCES AND REGULATIONS

The Developer shall abide by all ordinances and regulations of the City as they currently exist or as they may be amended from time to time. The Developer will further comply with all laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations applicable to the property and its development, whether federal, state, or local.

XIII. RECORDING

This agreement shall be recorded with the Clerk and Recorder of Fremont County and constitutes a covenant running with the land. This Agreement shall be binding on future successors and assigns of the Developer and all other persons hereinafter having any interest in the property.

XIV. AMEMDEMENTS AND ASSIGNMENTS

This Agreement may be amended or modified by the parties only by a written document making specific reference to this Agreement. This Agreement may be amended by the City Council with the prior, written consent of the Developer or subsequent property owners, so long as such an amendment affects only that owner's part of the property. Any such amendment or modification of this Agreement shall be recorded in the public records of Fremont County, shall be a covenant running with the land and shall be binding upon all persons or entities now or hereinafter having an interest in the property subject to the amendment, unless otherwise specified in the amendment. This Agreement may not be assigned by the Developer without the prior, written consent of the City Council, which consent may be withheld for any reason.

XV. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

- 1. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Colorado and shall bind and inure to the benefit of the parties, and their respective heirs, successors, and assigns.
- 2. Should either party institute legal proceedings in connection with any controversy or dispute arising out of this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to its costs and reasonable attorney's fees incurred in connection with such proceedings, including costs and fees incurred on appeal.
- 3. Each signatory to this Agreement represents and warrants that he, she or it is duly authorized to execute and deliver this Agreement on behalf of his or her principal and that the Agreement is executed in that capacity.
- 4. The parties agree to give such further assurances including the execution and delivery of such additional documents as are necessary to effectuate the purposes of this Agreement.
- 5. The City accepts no responsibility for, and makes no representations concerning, necessary federal, state, or other governmental permits or approvals which may be required in connection with the development of the property.
- 6. The Developer shall indemnify and hold the City harmless from, and shall defend the City against, any and all liability, responsibility, or claims which may be made against the City, and which arise out of the development of the property by the Developer or its successors in interest.

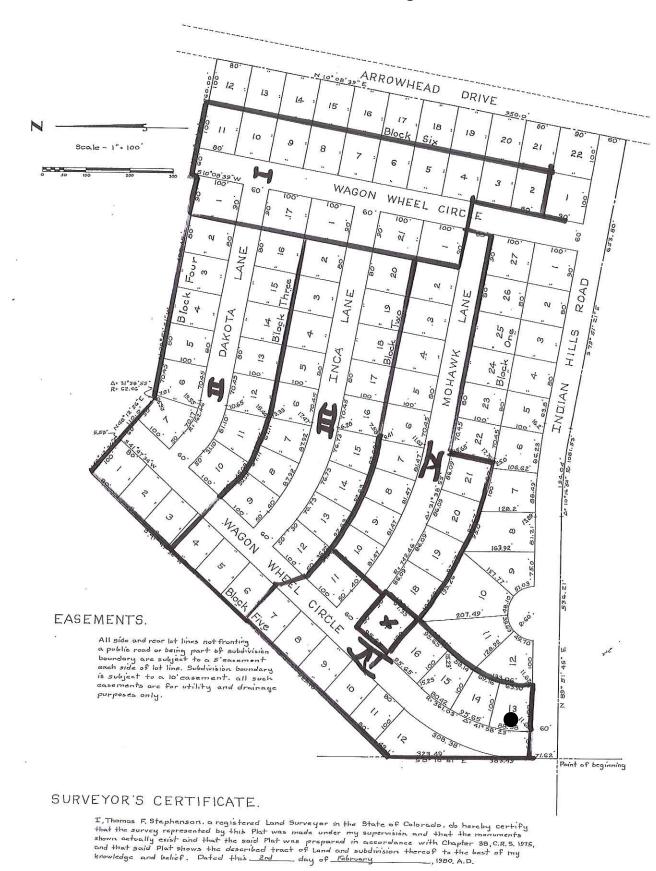

Department: Administration

Staff Recommendation:

Adopt a Resolution amending the Outside Agency Funding Requests Program for the City of Florence, Colorado

Background/Description of Item:

The Program document provides the necessary guidelines for the establishment of a uniform and efficient personnel management system in order to ensure fair treatment of applicants and equitable consideration during the budgeting process. The Program document provides rules and procedures for allocating funding based on feedback for goals and criteria of the program as provided by the City Council during the March 4, 2024, City Council workshop regarding non-profit funding. The Program document was originally adopted by the Florence City Council on April 1, 2024, with the adoption of Resolution 5-2024.

The Program document consists of five (5) sections, each covering a variety of topics related to the efficient and equitable distribution of funding to outside agencies:

• Program Purpose

o Provides general information regarding the purpose of the program and the spirit in which its implementation and execution are intended.

Eligibility Requirements

 Provides information regarding information required to be included on the application in order to promote accountability and good fiscal stewardship while ensuring, to the greatest extent possible, funding being requested will be utilized to create a positive and measureable effect within the City of Florence.

Ineligible Requests

o Provides information regarding specifically prohibited uses of funding.

Selection Process

 Provides information about the selection process, including the Review Committee, how said Committee is selected, and the Committee's role in vetting applicants for final selection by the City Council.

Allocation of Funds

Covers general information regarding how funds for the program are determined and distributed as well as information regarding disqualification from future funding.

In the spirit of continuous improvement, and after completing the 2024 Outside Agency Funding process in its entirety, Staff recommends considering a change to the program in which a "placeholder" amount of total funding is allocated towards the program as part of the budgeting process. This total funding is then distributed after the budget has been approved. This process will

still require applications, application review, and presentations to the Council as part of a regular City Council meeting.

This recommended change is consistent with the 2024 Outside Agency Funding process, where \$20,000 was included as a placeholder and maximum amount of funding to be distributed, with funds subsequently distributed up to this placeholder amount.

• It should be noted that the \$20,000 number for 2024 is included in this document for reference only; Council will adopt a total funding amount on an annual basis as part of the annual budgeting process. This funding amount may vary.

In order to facilitate this change, edits to the "Selection Process" and "Allocation of Funds" portions of the document are required. These edits as follows:

- Under the "Selection Process" section, the stipulation that the presentation takes place prior
 to the budget public hearing was removed and the process was changed to fully occur
 AFTER the annual budget for the funding year is finalized (i.e. budget finalized in late
 December; process starts in January and is completed in the first quarter of the year, with
 funding distributed immediately thereafter). Language was also added specifying the
 distribution of funds may take place at a subsequent regular City Council meeting following
 the meeting including presentations.
- Under the "Allocation of funds" section, language was added stating the Council will vote for a placeholder that provides the maximum amount of funding to be distributed under the program each year as part of the annual budget process. Additionally, adjustments to other contextual information in this section were made to ensure the spirit of adopting a "placeholder" then subsequently approving funding to a maximum of that placeholder instead of adopting a budget for each application individually is captured.
- Changed Appendix A flowchart to better match process stating that final approval was part of the funding distribution process rather than the budget approval process.

This change also allows for an additional opportunity for public input. In the previous iteration of the process, distribution of funds was intended to be part of the budget approval process, meaning the designated opportunities for public input were at the meeting where presentations were provided and at the budget Public Hearing. In the proposed updated process, a maximum amount of funds is set as part of the budget, meaning designated opportunities for public input are still the budget Public Hearing the meeting where presentations are given, with an additional opportunity at the meeting where the distribution of funds occurs.

The adoption of this Resolution adopts the amended Program document and its appendix by reference.

City of Florence, Colorado Outside Agency Funding Program Overview

Program Purpose

Community agencies can often provide services that municipal government cannot and may serve to fill in these service gaps, especially in areas such as health and well-being, the meeting of basic needs, youth programs, prevention programs, community activities, and the promotion of history, arts, and culture. This program is intended to provide financial support to such agencies so that they may continue to provide direct benefits to the City of Florence, Florence residents, and/or businesses within the City of Florence.

Eligibility Requirements

The requirements of this program are intended to ensure, to the greatest extent possible, that the funding being requested will be utilized to create a positive and measureable effect within the City of Florence. In order to ensure accountability and promote good fiscal stewardship, the City of Florence requires the following information for award consideration:

An Outside Agency Funding Request Form which has been completed and signed by the applicant. Information on this form includes the following:

- Information about the organization;
- Information about the activity, program, and/or service funding is being requested for;
- Information regarding the projected benefit to the community, including the number of Florence residents projected to be served;
- Other requests for funding;
- Information regarding measures of success and accountability

Ineligible Requests

The requested funding has restrictions and cannot be utilized for certain purposes including, but not limited to, the following.

- Building Maintenance
- Rent and/or mortgage payments
- The payment or any taxes and/or fees
- Salaries (including employee benefits)
- Utility payments



Selection Process

As specific dates will change on an annual basis such information will be posted to the City's website each year in advance of all deadlines. All dates will be based upon the City's budget calendar and budget process.

A time frame for accepting applications will be provided to applicants. Any applications received after this time frame will not be eligible for consideration. All applications received by the published deadline each years shall be reviewed by a Review Committee prior to any recommendations being made to the Florence City Council. Specific information regarding the Review Committee can be found later in this section.

All applicants selected by the Review Committee to make a presentation to the City Council must do so in order to be eligible to receive funding. Presentations shall:

- Take place at a regular City Council meeting, as a discussion item regarding the budget and entitled "Outside Agency Requests" on the City Council Meeting agenda; and
- Take place after the annual budget for the funding year has been finalized

The Outside Agency Funding Request Form, any supporting materials provided by the applicant, and the scoring matrices completed by the Review Committee shall be included as part of the agenda packet as a public record. Sensitive information will be redacted as legally allowed and necessary.

Following the presentation to the City Council, the Council will provide consensus for awards. The actual awards will not be made until the budget has been finalized and approved.

See Appendix A for associated flowchart outlining this process.

Review Committee

All applications received by the published deadline each years shall be reviewed by a review committee prior to any recommendations being made to the Florence City Council

Committee Makeup

A review committee including the following members be created on an annual basis:

- Two (2) City of Florence City Councilmembers
 - Said Councilmembers shall be nominated by and selected amongst themselves each year during a regular City Council meeting prior to the close of acceptance for applications
- The City Manager
- The Finance Director

On an annual basis, the Florence City Council may, by vote of the Council at a regular City Council meeting, choose to expand the makeup of the review committee.

Committee Responsibilities



In order to facilitate equitable review and award transparency, the Review Committee will review all applications received utilizing a scoring matrix. The scoring matrix shall include a minimum of the following items:

- Scores relating to benefits and projected impact
- Scores relating to physical location and providing for local preference
- Scores relating to if the funding is intended for a specific project or use, with preference for the same
- Scores relating to the applicant's 501C3 status, and providing for preference for said status
- Scores relating to the applicant's other funding requests, with preference for those who have requested funding from other entities in addition to the City of Florence

A minimum score will on the scoring matrix will be required in order for the applicant to be eligible for further consideration. The minimum score may vary on an annual basis depending on the total score possible, but shall always be greater than 50% of the total possible score.

Should the amount of eligible applicants exceed the amount of funding available, the Review Committee will recommend a practical amount of applicants to make a presentation to the Florence City Council during a regular City Council meeting as part of the budget process. This selection shall be based upon the numerical score obtained on the scoring matrix, starting with the highest score and continuing in reverse order until all spots have been allocated. The Review Committee may request that an applicant provide additional information and/or a presentation to the Committee as necessary.

Allocation of Funds

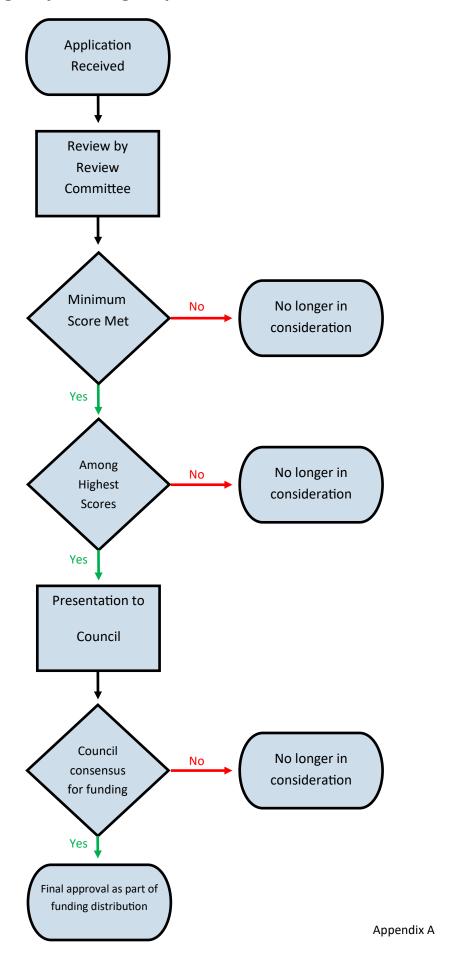
The City of Florence's maximum budget for outside agency funding may vary on an annual basis, will be reviewed each year as part of the budgeting process, and will be included as a "placeholder" in the City's annual budget so that the selection process may occur after the passage of the annual budget. Adjustments to the placeholder amount may occur on an annual basis and may be based on relevant factors including but not limited to economic conditions.

Failure of any applicant to submit a year-end report to the Florence City Council describing how any money that has been awarded was utilized may result in the applicant not being considered for future funding opportunities. Any requests for additional funding following the yearly initial funding allocation will not be considered.

Funds will not be eligible for distribution until after the associated budget has been finalized.

Following the presentation to the City Council, the Council will provide consensus for awards. The actual awards will not be made until the budget has been finalized and approved.

Suggested update:

Following the presentation to the City Council, the Council will provide consensus for awards. This may take place at a subsequent regular City Council Meeting

Reason for update:

This change is consistent with adopting a maximum placeholder as part of the budget process then subsequently awarding funding based on that placeholder. The previous timeline was based on awarding funding to each agency on an individual basis as part of the budget process. This change additionally recognizes that presentations and the subsequent distribution of funds are unlikely to occur at the same meeting, but ensures both portions of this process occur in a regular City Council meeting.

The City of Florence's estimated budget for outside agency funding will vary on an annual basis and may be adjusted as part of the budgeting process. Such adjustments may be based on relevant factors including but not limited to economic conditions, the number of applications submitted, and the amount of total funding requested.

Suggested update:

The City of Florence's maximum budget for outside agency funding may vary on an annual basis, will be reviewed each year as part of the budgeting process, and will be included as a "placeholder" in the City's annual budget so that the selection process may occur after the passage of the annual budget. Adjustments to the placeholder amount may occur on an annual basis and may be based on relevant factors including but not limited to economic conditions and other budget needs.

Reason for update:

This change initiates the process of adopting a maximum placeholder as part of the budget process then subsequently awarding funding based on that placeholder. The previous timeline was based on awarding funding to each agency on an individual basis as part of the budget process. The changes to relevant factors for adjustment reflect this change as well.

Background/Description of Item:

Note: this item is intended to serve as a placeholder, pending discussion of changes needed to the *Outside Agency Funding Requests Program Overview* (Program) document at the August 19, 2024, Florence City Council Meeting

The Outside Agency Funding Requests Program Overview (Program) document was adopted by the Florence City Council on April 1, 2024, with the adoption of Resolution 5-2024. The Program document provides rules and procedures for allocating funding based on feedback for goals and criteria of the program as provided by the City Council during the March 4, 2024, City Council workshop regarding non-profit funding.

The Selection Process section of the Program document provides information about the selection process, including the Review Committee, how said Committee is selected, and the Committee's role in vetting applicants for final selection by the City Council.

Per the Program document:

"In order to facilitate equitable review and award transparency, the Review Committee will review all applications received utilizing a scoring matrix."

The applications receiving a minimum score on the scoring matrix will be asked to make a presentation to the Florence City Council in order to determine which, if any, applicants will be awarded funding and at what amount. The Review Committee does not make any final decisions regarding funding; the sole purpose of the Review Committee is to screen out applicants who do not meet basic criteria as outlined in the Program document.

For 2025, funding requests are due by August 29, 2024, with presentations to the City Council currently scheduled for the September 16, 2024, regular Florence City Council meeting. The scoring matrixes completed by the Review Committee will be public records and those for applicants scheduled to give a presentation before the City Council will be included in the September 16, 2024, agenda packet.

With regard to the makeup and selection of Review Committee members, the Program document states (in pertinent part):

"A review committee including the following members be created on an annual basis:

- Two (2) City of Florence City Councilmembers
 - Said Councilmembers shall be nominated by and selected amongst themselves each year during a regular City Council meeting prior to the close of acceptance for applications
- The City Manager
- The Finance Director"

Following this guidance, the Florence City Council will need to nominate and select two (2) Councilmembers from amongst themselves in order to fulfill this requirement.

Councilmembers Stiefel and Vanhoutan served on the 2024 Review Committee.

- Colorado Intergovernmental Risk Sharing Agency (CIRSA) August 15, 2024
 - Attended a CIRSA member luncheon and meeting.
- Planning Commission August 15, 2024
 - Attended the August Planning Commission meeting.

Internal Meetings/Discussion/Projects

- Staff has started the 2025 Budget review with our first rounds of internal meetings on the budget.
- The City of Florence is accepting sign-ups for the City's new communications initiative run through the Constant Contact platform. This initiative allows citizens to sign up to receive notifications and information on topics of their choosing. A sign up form is available on the City's website.
- Since the City's migration to an electronic billing platform, enrollments in auto-pay and other features of the system as well as opt-ins to electronic billing have continued to increase on a daily basis.
- Code Enforcement has been busy sending out notifications regarding weeds and other issues throughout the City as well as working with the County on plans to address properties adjacent to the City of Florence, but not within the City's jurisdiction.
